The Domestic Renewable Heat Incentive

The DRHI is a government financial incentive to promote the use of renewable sources of heat. People who join the scheme, and stick to its rules, receive quarterly payments for seven years for the amount of clean, green renewable heat it's estimated their system produces. The Smart Export Guarantee

This is a government scheme whereby electricity generated on a small scale (*) by the following methods - solar photovoltaic (solar PV), wind, micro combined heat and power, hydro, and anaerobic digestion - can be fed into the grid and paid for by the local electricity company.
