On 1-5 November 2021 The Marches School will be holding a Climate Futures Week, to coincide with the United Nations' Climate Change Conference in Glasgow.

The Week is intended to inspire students to become future leaders and be part of the solutions for tackling climate change.

The week will involve:

- · Assemblies and form-time activities about climate change
- Climate-themed lessons across a range of subjects (from Art, to Maths and Geography)
- A Climate Solutions Fair (see below)
- A mock climate change international conference (see below)
- A tree of students' personal pledges for action on climate change.

 - Organisations such as: Oswestry Town Council, Zero Carbon Shropshire, the Environment Agency, Aico, and Treflach Farm
 - · Live cooking demonstrations from OsNosh
 - Live animals (including chickens and a pig)
 - An electric car
 - 3D models of flooding and a sustainable house
 - Student voting on global- and Marches' School action on climate change.
- Friday's Marches Climate Summit, 9am-1pm, Marches Library. A
 selection of students from across different year groups will represent different
 countries from around the world, debate, and agree priorities for action. The
 event will start with a live link to the UN Climate Change Conference in
 Glasgow.
